Final, reviewed manuscripts need to be received by PRIDE by **April 1**, 2005 on computer disk and in paper copy. Presented manuscripts will be published following the symposium. Please be sure your papers are typed in Times New Roman (font) and size (12)

Each abstract will be available in English and Chinese prior to the start of the conference, affording attendees the opportunity to review them in advance to better facilitate discussion. Each individual will have time for a presentation of their key points followed by a discussion period. The conference will include plenary sessions, and group-presentation sessions. In addition, free periods during the days and evenings will provide participants with the opportunity to pursue mutual interests, share published materials, and build professional and personal relationships.

The conference will stimulate participants to transcend the bounds of theoretical research, to help create practical models for addressing ethical or moral issues.
